## Fabric Collage by Jane Haworth

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## General Supply List ~

You may use my sample as inspiration or choose your own colorway.

Selection of fabrics to suit your pattern. More variety of fabrics makes collage easier. These can be small pieces 4-10" or scraps. I use a variety of plains, hand-dyes, batiks, small prints, tone-on-tone, texture prints, kaffes etc

- $\sim$  Approx.1/2 yd piece of Pellon foundation: Easy Pattern, Tru Grid or similar. You need to be able to see through it. This acts as a stabilizer that the collage is glued to during the process.
- ~ Scissors, sharp and good for cutting small pieces of fabric. I like Karen Kay Buckley Perfect 6" scissors.
- ~ Chalk marking tool or similar, disappearing pen, and Pencil. I like the Bonin chalk pencil (red one)
- ~ Fabric glue, I use Aleenes Tacky Glue. You can use school glue, or other fabric glues like Roxannes Basting Glue.
- ~ Small container for glue and Tool for applying glue like a toothpick or similar. (I use a school glue spreader.)
- ~ Optional: Tweezers Light box, Parchment paper or clear pressing sheet.

My supply list is for the collage only.

I usually choose my background fabric after the collage is complete.

- ~ Fabric piece 18" x 18" for backing and batting.
- ~ Sewing machine with straight and free motion foot
- ~ Assorted colored threads

I have other patterns and kits available for purchase on my website.
